Purposed Generation

In our world corrupted by sin, the current of worldliness is very strong. Everyone is affected by its impact and influence. It presents itself in subtle temptations, evil influences, unholy associations, popular opinion, and sometimes it reveals itself through force.

This current flows down as a rushing river that is impossible for anyone to resist in their own power. It is like kayaking on a river against the current. The moment you stop paddling and pushing forward, the current will immediately cause you to drift downstream. In order to move forward upstream, you must push forward against the current with determination, purpose, and endurance.

Spiritually, we can only resist and move forward against the overwhelming current of the world through the power of Christ. Jesus gives us a purpose that enables us to advance against the current of the world and the strength to endure.

Understanding your God-given mission and purpose in life is very essential. It creates your identity and drives everything you do in life. You are therefore enabled to move forward in life with confidence and certainty because your life has a reason and a purpose for living.

You are described as "...a chosen generation,

a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light." (1 Peter 2:9). Peculiar means "purchased." You were chosen by God and purchased by His redeeming blood to show forth in your life the excellence of Christ and the power of His transforming grace that changed you from being a child of darkness into a son and daughter of God.

In Christ, we receive a new identity. Your identity is who you are and how you identify yourself. We all have an identity that is either founded in Christ or in the sinful world. Understanding your identity is very important because it identifies where your loyalty stands. Is your identity founded in Christ, or is it founded in the evil passions of the sinful heart? Is your loyalty given to Christ or the world?

Our identity naturally is founded in the sinful flesh. "Behold, I was shapen in iniquity; and in sin did my mother conceive me." (Psalms 51:5). Therefore, our natural identity must be recreated. In Christ, we must be born into a new identity that is founded in His life.

The circumcision of our heart is a sign of the covenant we make with God when we yield our lives to him. This is a covenant of a new creation, the creation of a new identity. It is a covenant that God is your Father, and you are His sons and daughters. Your identity that was once a child of darkness is now recreated into being a child of God. Your identity

becomes founded in Christ. Your life is surrendered. Your life belongs to Him, and you are not your own. As a child of God, you are a chosen generation called to live a life of righteousness and holiness in Christ. Your new life and purpose in Christ creates this new identity. In this new identity, we receive an invitation to something higher, a holy calling, new principles and standards in life. This is a calling that is given by Jesus Christ Himself.

Christ "...gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works." (Titus 2:14). Christ has redeemed us with His blood and has chosen us out of this world to be a peculiar people. In this text, the word peculiar means, according to the Strong's Greek dictionary, "being beyond usual." In the eyes of the world, the Christian is to be seen as beyond usual. As a chosen generation, we are called to live lives that are in contrast to the world.

This really goes back to Genesis 3:15 when God said that there will be a distinction between the people of God and worldliness. God was going to have a people who would have enmity against sin. Since God's people are to have enmity against worldliness and sin, there will be a difference between God's people and the people of the world.

The principles of the gospel effect this difference. The grace of God transforms the life. (Read Titus 3:3-7). Because of Christ's grace, we are justified and renewed by the Holy Spirit. This renewing by the Holy Spirit transforms the life. In this process of

renewing we are taught principles that are totally different from our old life. The grace of Christ teaches us to deny “ungodliness and worldly lusts” and “live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world”. (Titus 2:11-15). The life that was in times past “foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy” and hateful becomes one that is kind, loving, understanding, filled with the knowledge of God.

Christ fulfills all of the good pleasure of His grace in your life, which work you receive by faith and is accomplished by His infinite power. (Read 2 Thessalonians 1:11). Because of Christ’s grace, you are a new creation “...renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him”. Colossians 3:10 You are recreated “in righteousness and true holiness”. (Ephesians 4:22-24). Every aspect of your life changes. Your life will then “bear the image of the heavenly”. (1 Corinthians 15:48,49). You no longer work the works of the world. Because of Christ’s righteousness, you have “...cast off the works of darkness” and have “put on the armour of light.” (Romans 13:12).

As you dwell with Christ and behold God, you “...are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord.” (2 Corinthians 3:18). As you follow the footsteps of Christ, you will walk as He walks. (1 John 2:6). Christ’s character will be made manifest in your life. Holiness and godliness will become the essence of your life, because Christ is your life.

Your identity in Christ enables you to stand with purpose in the midst of a godless society. When you are faced with evil, your identity in God enables you to reject evil in the power of Christ. You reject it because your life is not your own, because you are a son and daughter of God, because you are called with a righteous and holy calling. You stand with integrity because your identity is founded in Christ.

Integrity is a steadfast principle for righteousness. Integrity is standing for right, though the heavens fall. It is when one, who is under the control of God, determines and purposes in their heart to do what is right, no matter the

consequences. We learn lessons of integrity from the life of Job, Joseph, in the life of Daniel, and his three friends, individuals who, even in the face of utter loss and death, held fast their integrity.

Job lost everything he had, his family, his possessions, his health, yet he said in faith, “...till I die I will not remove mine integrity from me. My righteousness I hold fast, and will not let it go: my heart shall not reproach me so long as I live.” “...the LORD gave, and the LORD hath taken away; blessed be the name of the LORD.” (Job 1:21; 27:5,6). And God’s record of Job was that there was “...none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil.” (Job 2:3).

In the face of great temptation, Joseph determined in his heart that he would not sin against God even when it meant losing the authority he had and being a prisoner.

Joseph was able to stand because he knew his identity. He was God’s and God was his Father. From a very young age, he had been circumcised which was a sign of the covenant that God had made with Abraham. As God’s son, he was called to righteousness and integrity. Understanding this, he said, “How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?” (Genesis 39:9).

When the defiled meat of the kingdom of Babylon was set before Daniel and his three friends, “Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king’s meat, nor with the wine which he drank.” (Daniel 1:8). In the face of a death decree, Daniel maintained his faithfulness and prayed to God even

though, to all human appearance, it meant certain death at the hands of lions. In the face of a fiery death, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego refused to worship the golden image of Babylon. They told the king in Daniel 3:16-18, “O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter. If it be so, our God whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will deliver us out of thine hand, O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king, that we will not serve thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up.” Daniel and his three friends had a purpose worth dying for. They were enabled to stand with purpose and courage in the power of God because they understood their God given identity and calling.

Like the men and women of times past, you must also purpose in your heart. In the midst of a godless society, you must stand purposed in your heart to be loyal to Christ, though the heavens fall. When the world around you is bowing, you must stand with integrity to follow truth. Though the cause of Christ is reproached, when your life is threatened, and the only thing before you is a fiery furnace, you must stand steadfast with a determination to hold fast to righteousness no matter the consequences.

Jesus will prove Himself faithful to you. In the power of God, you will fulfill His high calling in your life showing forth to the world the excellence of Christ. He will enable you to live a life worthy of your high calling in Christ to be true, steadfast, and loyal to God and a blessing to society. In Christ, you will live a life of purpose, faith, and courage. Through Him, you will be victorious.

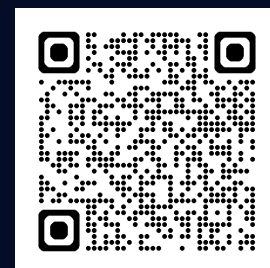

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A Lesson from the Lily

In perfecting a Christian character, it is essential to persevere in right-doing. I would impress upon our youth the importance of perseverance and energy in the work of character-building. From the earliest years it is necessary to weave into the character principles of stern integrity, that the youth may reach the highest standard of manhood and womanhood. They should ever keep the fact before their eyes that they have been bought with a price, and should glorify God in their bodies and spirits, which are his. The youth should seriously consider what shall be their purpose and life work, and lay the foundation in such a way that their habits shall be free from all taint of corruption. If they would stand in a position where they shall influence others, they must be self-reliant. The lily on the lake strikes its roots down deep beneath the surface of rubbish and slime, and through its porous stem draws those properties that will aid its development, and bring to light its spotless blossom to repose in purity on the bosom of the lake. It refuses all that would tarnish and mar its spotless beauty.

We may learn a lesson from the lily, and although surrounded with influences that would tend to corrupt the morals, and bring ruin upon the soul, we may refuse to be corrupted, and place ourselves where evil association shall not corrupt our hearts. Individually the youth should

seek for association with those who are toiling upward with unfaltering steps. They should shun the society of those who are absorbing every evil influence, who are inactive and without earnest desire for attainment of a high standard of character, who cannot be relied upon as persons who will be true to principle. Let the youth be found in association with those who fear and love God; for these noble, firm characters are represented by the lily that opens its pure blossom on the bosom of the lake. They refuse to be molded by the influences that would demoralize, and gather to themselves only that which will aid the development of a pure and noble character. They are seeking to be conformed to the divine model.

If you will follow that which is good, you will cultivate moral qualities that will make you a blessing to others through all your life; for you will incite in them a desire to become noble and Christlike. It is the work of the youth to make advancement day by day. Peter says, "Add to your faith virtue; and to virtue, knowledge; and to knowledge, temperance; and to temperance, patience; and to patience, godliness; and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ." All these successive steps are not to be kept before the mind's eye, and counted as you start; but fixing the eye upon Jesus, with an eye single to the glory of God, you will make advancement.

You cannot reach the full measure of the stature of Christ in a day, and you would sink in despair could you behold all the difficulties that must be met and overcome. You have Satan to contend with, and he will seek by every possible device to attract your mind from Christ. But we must meet all obstacles placed in our way, and overcome them one at a time. If we overcome the first difficulty, we shall be stronger to meet the next, and at every effort will become better able to make advancement. By looking to Jesus, we may be overcomers. It is by fastening our eyes on the difficulties and shrinking from earnest battle for the right, that we become weak and faithless.

By taking one step after another, the highest ascent may be climbed, and the summit of the mount may be reached at last. Do not become overwhelmed with the great amount of work you must do in your lifetime, for you are not required to do it all at once. Let every power of your being go to each day's work, improve each precious opportunity, appreciate the helps that God gives you, and make advancement up the ladder of progress step by step. Remember that you are to live but one day at a time, that God has given you one day, and heavenly records will show how you have valued its privileges and opportunities. May you so improve every day given you of God, that at last you may hear the Master say, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant."

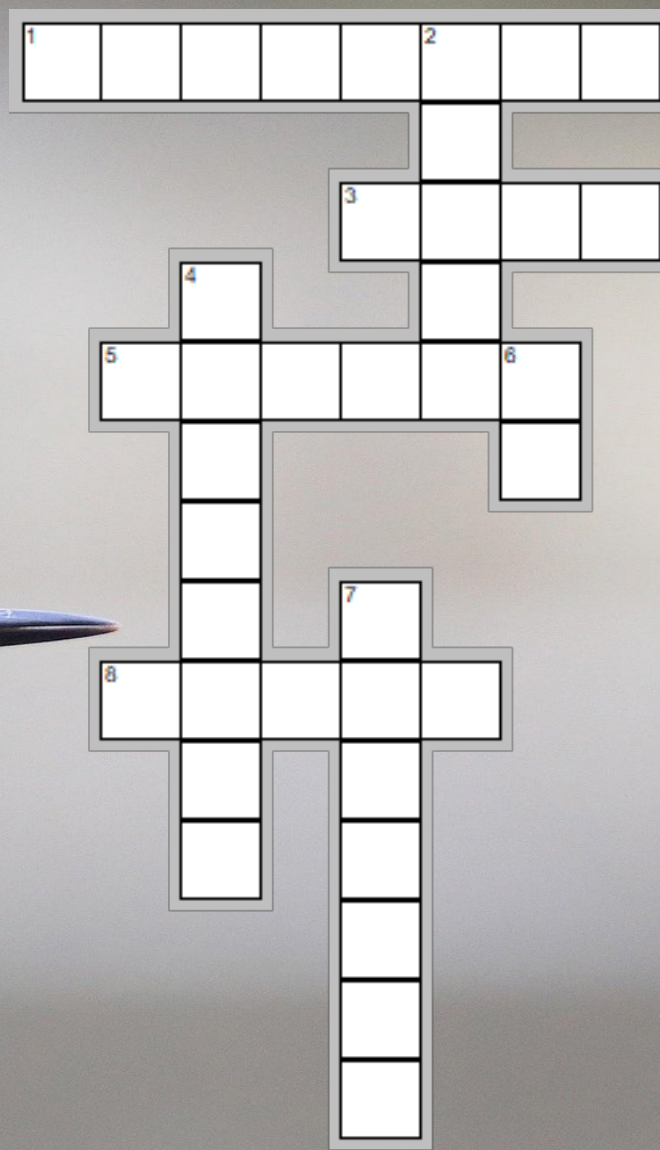

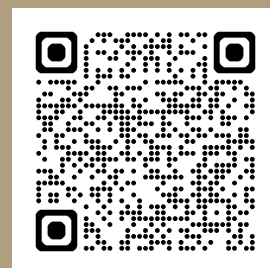
